Whether it's notifying Residential Advisors of a leaking shower head that wastes water or whether it's about finding out how they can get involved in the green movement at UCI, the first year residents of Mesa Court's Global Sustainability hall, Vista, are on top of their game and seeking to promote sustainability within and outside the hall.

Not only are residents of Vista thinking about ways they can make a difference, but they have also begun to adapt their lifestyles by using the new technology in Vista to save water. This year's Vista residents are the first group of students in Mesa Court's history to have motion sensor, dual flush toilets, and shower

heads with a pause function. Residents also have a hydration station, recycled carpet, and multiple recycling bins within the hall.

Parisians Push Green Cars to New Limits

One day, I was exploring the Champs Elysee, one of the busiest and most central street in Paris, when I stumbled across a concept car exhibition held by the French car company, Renault. Displayed in the "What is your Eco gesture?" one hundred percent electric car. Situated right across on the other front window was a car completely covered in grass.; obviously not for function, but it was definitely an attention getter.

One concept I found really interesting was their idea of having "Quickdrop Stations." These stations would allow for long trips without drivers having to wait for their batteries to recharge. A driver with low battery could pull into a Quickdrop station, drop off their drained battery, and pick up one that has been fully charged at the station. As the driver drives off in their new fully charged battery, their old one gets sent into a rotation as it charges and waits its turn to be placed in another electric

car once it has been fully

My favorite part of the exhibition was their big wall of post-its titled, "ET VOUS, QUEL EST VOTRE ECO-GESTE?," which translates to, "And you, What is your ecogesture?" Hundreds of postits contained messages from all the people who visited the exhibit. It was a wall expressing the environmental thoughts of people from all around the world. Green Happenings on the Horizon

Many UCs have passed student sponsored sustainability funds, often called "The Green Initiative Fund," or TGIF. Last year TGIF passed at UC Irvine. Former UCI Green Campus intern Max Broad, who graduated in 2009, helped pass TGIF. A \$3.50 fee was added to the student tuition, creating a budget of about \$120,000 per year. Since Max, there has been interest within the Green Campus program to have somebody apply for a TGIF position, in efforts to collaborate and get

projects going. Over the summer, current intern Bogdan Rusu applied for



the Marketing Commissioner position, and was elected. One of the fundamental questions that he deals with is how to market TGIF to more than 20,000 undergraduate students. It is most likely that the students involved in sustainability oriented organizations on campus will apply for

TGIF grants to fund their projects. It is Bogdan's wish to give the Green Campus club members and for-credit interns all the support and information they need to successfully apply for grants and get their energy efficiency projects funded. On the other end, he is currently working with TGIF interns and commissioners to make the application process as straight forward as possible, by shortening the 10 page application and creating specific applications for infrastructure, education, research, sustainable services, or
